The Summer Reading Club runs from December 1 to the end of January and is a themed program that aims to encourage a continued love of reading and ongoing multi-literacy skills development during the summer holidays.

Clarence Valley Council's Summer Reading Club for young people from birth to 17 years of age will start on December 1.

Regional librarian, Kathryn Breward, said Clarence Valley libraries ran the program each year to encourage young people to continue reading or being read to throughout the holidays.

"We want them to make reading a regular part of their lives – an exciting pastime – and use libraries all year round," she said. "An extended holiday break means they will have plenty of time to relax with a good book, whether they're home, at the beach, interstate or further afield.

"This program gives kids something fun to do over the holidays and helps students return to school in the New Year ready to learn with greater reading fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension."
